
50 Strange shapes

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| Overview | Participants are divided into teams. Each team is given an envelope containing an assortment of cut out shapes. The team's task is to assemble the shapes. They cannot speak to anyone. |
| Uses | Building trust. Energising participants. Forming or regrouping teams. Improving team communication. |
| Learning point | • The benefits of inter-group communication. |
| Time | • 15 minutes. |
| Numbers | • Any, with a minimum of six. |
| Materials | A copy of Handout 50 Strange shapes, for each participant A bus timetable or a map Envelopes |
| Preparation | • Print out or photocopy the Handout(s) required. |
| Q - | • Gather together the materials described above. |
| | • Before the training session, find a bus timetable or a map and cut this into small pieces. Put the pieces into envelopes, ensuring that there is an even distribution of pieces across all the envelopes. |
| What to do | • Divide the participants into teams of three to six. |
| | • Distribute a copy of Handout 50 <i>Strange shapes</i> , to each participant and check that everyone knows what to do. Emphasise that they must not speak or they will be immediately disqualified. |
